


Taighean a' Chaiseil, Staffin, Isle of Skye



Taighean a' Chaiseil: overview

- Families living in six three-bedroom homes (SCT, CHT and LSHA built two each)
- Total of 12 adults and eight children
- New health centre (owned by Staffin Community Trust) replace ageing building: NHS Highland is long-term tenant with GP practice and other services provided
- Local aquaculture company Organic Sea Harvest is long-term tenant of 2 new business units, also community-owned

Development's benefits to community

- Supporting and increasing primary school roll and population
- Brand new £250k community health centre to support delivery of health services in North Skye
- Business premises supporting a company which employs 18 people in Staffin
- A total £1.6million investment in our infrastructure and services, bulk of which is community-owned.
- Annual surplus from rental income of SCT properties to support other community projects

Project Timeline

- Aug 1999: Last affordable homes built in Staffin, Ilse of Skye.
- Sep 2014: housing needs report published identifies clear demand for affordable homes: 18% of stock was holiday houses and Staffin suffering damaging loss of families and young people
- March 2018: Planning application approved (one year after being submitted)
- **Dec 2019:** Hearing at Portree Sheriff Court into site's resumption from croftland
- Aug 2020: Kate Forbes MSP performs turf cutting on site
- Feb 2022: families move into new homes
