How can embedding artistic approaches enable communities to become agents for change? SURF Awards Shared Learning Workshop – 23rd July 2020

Background

SURF and the Scottish Government work together to identify and highlight excellence and innovation in initiatives that address social and economic challenges in disadvantaged communities through the annual SURF Awards for Best Practice in Community Regeneration.

This free half-day SURF Awards workshop event in the Grassmarket Community Project, Edinburgh on 23rd July provides an opportunity to explore successful approaches towards linking creative arts and culture into regeneration initiatives. The winning and highly commended projects from the 'Creative Regeneration' category highlighted in the 2019 SURF Awards process will provide comment on their experiences and transferable learning.

Workshop guests will firstly hear from a project representative from the 'Creative Regeneration' category winner **WHALE Arts.** Founded by local community members in 1992, and starting life in a porta-cabin, it has since established itself as the cultural anchor organisation for Wester Hailes. They now operate from a unique community asset with a range of creative spaces including an arts workshop, performance space, and a community garden.

Guests will then hear from highly commended **Inverness Creative Academy**. Led by Wasps Studios the project aimed to establish a regional cultural hub in a vacant, historically significant school building. Creating creative studio space for 44 artists and craftspeople. It also offers two community workshop spaces, an exhibition space, and a photographic darkroom.

Finally, guests will then hear from the second of the highly commended projects **The Glasgow Barons**. Led by Paul MacAlinden, the Barons aim to revitalise the inner city area of Govan through music. A modern orchestral ensemble founded in 2018, they put on a range of events and workshops, aiming to release creativity within the community and raise the areas profile as a creative hub.

The event will close with presentations from **Creative Scotland** and **the Scottish Government Culture Team** providing detail on their current priorities towards supporting creative arts organisations and the Culture Strategy. It will then open up to a discussion on National Policy.

The SURF Awards 'Creative Regeneration' judging panel team – comprising representatives of Creative Scotland, WAVEparticle, Bellsmyre Development Trust and the Scottish Government – were particularly enthused by the collaborative approaches taken by each project and the lasting impact in each area within all three shortlisted projects in this category.

This workshop is being delivered with support from Creative Scotland.
