



What does Levelling Up look like?



In short, Levelling Up should look different in each place. It is about:

- **Longevity and policy sufficiency**: Progress requires long-lived, sustained and consistent policy efforts that are commensurate with the scale of disparity.
- **Policy and delivery coordination**: Successful local growth policy requires strategic coordination across the different arms of policy, as well as across the public, private and voluntary sectors.
- Local empowerment: Coordinating between the private sector, civil society and government is best done at the local level where decision-makers have a finely grained understanding of local economies and the challenges they face.
- **Evidence, monitoring and evaluation**: Rigorous evaluation of government spending and policy intervention is needed to understand what is working and the contribution policy is making to closing spatial differences.
- **Transparency and accountability**: Well-defined policy goals and policies require mechanisms to ensure that decision-makers are held to account transparently for the choices they make and whether objectives are being met.
