




Who is Westray Development Trust?

Community Grants


- Up to 80% funding for projects of community benefit.
- On average applications are for under £2,000 but we will consider up to £50,000.

Education Grants

- 50% of course fees up to a maximum of £500 per person per year.
- Up to 10 hours of driving lessons.
- Most popular grant scheme.

Entertainment Grants

- Up to £500 per event for entertainment expenses. E.g. band travel & accommodation costs.
