

Three Important early reflections...

- 1. Neighbourhoods seem more 'relatable' in Urban situations Rural places and communities are very different.
- 2. Relationship based Place-making/shaping does take time. Radical incrementalism is wise. It's just we're in a climate emergency...
- 3. The order of magnitude in addressing the predominantly 20th century, urban sprawl and movement patterns, must surely be addressed and retrofitted somehow?



(Spectum - not Binary)








Experts don't start by already knowing the answer. They start by asking pragmatic questions such as:

What is this place?
























Medieval Suburbs (the original liveable Neighbourhood + sanitation improvements etc)







2. **Middle** Level Neighbourhood Contexts


3. **Detailed** Level Street extents for focused intervention/detailed design

North Perth Neighbourhood Advisory Group Terms of Reference (draft)

Liveable Neigbourhoods are a key and recurring feature at the heart of sustainable, healthy and safer communities where people, nature and enterprise can thrive. They help create the local conditions for the Perth Vision: A place for everyone to live life well.



Purpose & Role

To bring together, Community representatives, including from business and enterprise in North Perth, with a shared interest in participating in projects which aim to maintain and improve; the local streets, paths, public open space networks and sustainable transport - both infrastructure and services.

Urban Neighbourhoods typically have a catchment area greater in size, than any single community or Community Councils' boundary.

The primary role of the group, is in advising and participating, where possible, in local engagement, design and consultation for improved Sustainable Transport and Active Travel projects across your local Neighbourhood.

The aims of this group are to:

- Help advise PKC's projects team with ongoing local research & survey work during design development and project(s) delivery stages;
- Advise on delivery of local engagement & consultation events;
- Help facilitate collaboration in the design process to optimise locally informed; and locally responsive improvement proposals.

Responsibilities of this group are to:

- Collaborate across community boundaries on matters of shared interest specifically Sustainable Transport and Active Travel;
- Continue to reflect the views, concerns and aspirations of local residents, key local groups including visitors to the area;
- Advise on relevant local visions, plans or projects, current or emerging, which are relevant to the purpose of the group; and
- Establish whether this group could provide a basis for developing future Local Place Plans, their coordination and delivery.

Anticipated Outcomes

- Strengthened local, inclusive, informed, democratic decision-making;
- Healthier and safer streets and public open spaces;
- Enhanced natural environments:
- More accessible streets, public spaces and transport systems;
- More sustainable places for everyone.




- Improve the health and well-being of local people and visitors to Perth by reducing pollution and making more active forms of transport and travel safer and easier to access.

We can't understand People, without understanding context.. And we can't understand Place without understanding complex overlapping elements (or we increase risks in decision-making)


Note:

The movement system is a democratic system - and a shared asset which we all have a stake in across multiple communities (by any definition).




























Perth...

This can then be refined to reflect more accurately existing routes and barriers to movement.


Health supporting Sustainable Places = key outcomes



Why do we need to get into motorised transport in the first place?















Neighbourhoods - a *process* informing *and* being informed by, our Local Development Plan LDP processes (& Transport Planning) via collaboration.

Reflections at this Stage:

- Low Trust conditions just now generally with 'experts' consistency of Terminology may help;
- Our approach thus far, has helped with our social licence to operate through coprocess and co-learning with local experts and specialist experts;
- Frameworks are pragmatic tools to help map, evidence and therefore help co-ordinate prioritised and targeted changes;
- Shared Neighbourhood / mid-scale survey baselines studies can significantly help to achieve better value(s) for time and money;
- Potential to reduce consultation fatigue with Neighbourhoods of multiple communities working together on shared interests;
- They can reduce risks; and
- They can help nurture and strengthen Trust... (as we face multiple emergencies).
