Knocknagael Ltd is a community not-for-profit organisation looking to secure a Community Asset Transfer for the smiddy field part of the Scottish Government owned Knocknagael Bull Farm.

The aim is to develop it into a green hub including:

- Allotment site
- Community growing areas, including a community orchard, to provide a greater social and cohesive spirit
- An outdoor area for walking and outdoor activities in a safe environment, and proving wildlife habitat in an increasingly urbanised area
- Growing and training space, available for different organisations and for schools
- Community growing area to develop a Community Supported Agriculture project

A green hub that will get more people in our community spending time outdoors and growing and enjoying local produce.


- 2013 Fields at Knocknagael Bull Stud Farm earmarked for disposal by Scottish Government
- Local opposition to housing development on prime agricultural land, in response to loss of farmland and growing awareness of climate change. Community Campaign
- 2015 Proposal for housing use rejected
  Knocknagael Allotment Association established -
- 2017 Feasibility Study
- 2018-19 Work with Development Trusts Association Scotland (DTAS) and Highland and Islands Enterprise
- 2019 first ATR
- 2020 Knocknagael Ltd. established to take ownership of site
- SLF Stage 1 Funds secured and Community Enterprise appointed
- Community Consultation, feasibility study & landscape report
- 2021 Contact with RPID






