THE 3 AIMS we agreed for Our Proposal were:

• Creative: It would include imaginative things which our community would love, but might never have thought of themselves.

A (Better) Place for Everyone:

- It needed to consider the needs of different people in our community, and include things for everyone.
- It would feel like it belonged to our community -something we'd all be proud of- as then people would care for it more, and not litter and vandalise it.
- It could "give back" something to locals (e.g. food)
- It would make the place safer, cleaner and more beautiful for those who live there and use it.

Buildable

 It should be possible to build any of the imaginative things we come up with.

ZONE 1: A COMMUNITY SQUARE

Gates

- Easy to open for funerals, so the hearse can easily pass (maybe remote control?)
- A permanent entrance for cyclists, so they don't have to slow down going down the hill, and for walkers

Signs telling people what kind of a square we want it to be:

- A space by and for our community
- No dog poo please
- No litter please
- No vandalism please
- No cigarettes
- No empty or broken bottles

A Treehouse or Secret Base

 A cool den just for young people, where we can hang out, play, which is sheltered and has a nice view



"Rainbow Bridge"

- Painted by us
- Signifying all different emotions and people in a community
- Could absorb lor reflect sunlight in a way which is beautiful, or so it glows at night
- With a nice view
- With a glass roof for shelter if it rains
- With a glass floor to watch things go underneath
- Wide enough for hearses and emergency vehicles to easily get under
- With signs saying 'no vandalism'
- If not over the road, then maybe over a pond?

Through Road

Wide enough for hearses, cyclists and walkers

Natural or food-growing areas

- Benches for elderly people to sit and enjoy
- Trees, flowers and grass
- A place that encourages and helps wildlife
- A nice pond
- Maybe fruit trees or areas to grow food for the community, like St Paul's Youth Forum
- Bins so people don't leave litter






Levels of happiness are decreasing




